#### The Fellowship of the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts

is one of the oldest Alumni art nonprofit organizations in America and staffed solely by volunteers, which speaks of the impressive loyalty and dedication of our board and artists.

### We are an independent entity, with its sole purpose to benefit all PAFA Alumni.

On Monday evening, April 19, 1897, approximately five hundred people met in the Pennsylvania Academy lecture room to form an organization of alumni that would come to be known worldwide as The Fellowship of the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts. They came together at the behest of Edward H. Coates, President of PAFA, and Harrison S. Morris, Managing Director. The idea had been endorsed by 32 prominent artists. Robert Vonnoh, a former student and later Academy instructor, suggested that a notice be sent to several thousand alumni.

After 125 years the Fellowship is still going strong and is proud to celebrate this year's Annual Exhibition at the Academy from November 17, 2022 through January 14, 2023. This year our Juror was Audrey Flack who has selected the art work and the awards. Visit the Anne Bryan Gallery in the Hamilton Building during museum hours. Alumni are admitted free. The works are for sale in the gallery through the front museum shop and on our virtual gallery website: www. fellowshipgallery.org with their shop link.

This year's exhibition is again composed of two shows. One Live gallery exhibition and a virtual show on a monitor in the live gallery and on the Fellowship virtual gallery website. The Live exhibition displays 84 works all by Academy Alumni. The virtual exhibition displays 54 works all by Academy Alumni. John Thornton and Miriam Seidel, both Academy alumni, are creating a video and dialogue of the entire exhibition that will be linked to the sites as well as our own website by the end of November.

Thank you Audrey Flack, our generous Juror, artist and her wonderful consultant, Severin Delfs for his help during the process. Thank you to Clint Jukkala, School Executive Dean and Kate McCammon who kept all the physical workings running smoothly to launch this live show. Thanks to David Heshmatpour for his professional help during the installation. Joseph Rodriguez for his video and virtual slide show in the gallery. I also personally thank our Fellowship Board of Directors and Advisors who help make our organization a great support for PAFA Alumni, especially John Formicola, Rachel Citrino and Sandra Benhaim. We all thank, Mostafa Darwish, our Virtual Gallery Director, board member and alumni artist for his work for with all our virtual exhibitions year-round.

### **ABOUT OUR 2022 JUROR, AUDREY FLACK**

Audrey Flack is an internationally acclaimed painter, sculptor, and a pioneer of photorealism. Ms. Flack enjoys the distinction of being the first Photorealist painter whose work was purchased by the Museum of Modern Art for its permanent collection. Among many major museums around the world, her work also resides in The Metropolitan Museum of Art, Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, Whitney Museum of American Art, National Museum of Women in the Arts, Butler Institute of American Art, National Gallery of Australia, Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, and the Allen Memorial Art Museum. Additionally, she is the first woman artist, along with Mary Cassatt, to be included in Janson's History of Art text.

Among her public commissions are Monumental Gateway to the City of Rock Hill in South Carolina, consisting of four twenty-foot high bronze figures on granite pedestals; Veritas et Justitia, a fifteen foot high figure of Justice for the Thirteenth Judicial Courthouse in Tampa, Florida; and Islandia, a nine-foot high bronze sculpture for the New York City Technical College in Brooklyn, New York. A major retrospective of her work organized by the J.B. Speed Art Museum in Louisville, Kentucky has traveled to museums around the country beginning in 1992.

Audrey Flack has taught and lectured extensively both nationally and internationally. She

was awarded the Augustus St. Gaudens Medal from Cooper Union, was an honorary Albert Dorne Professor at Bridgeport University, and awarded an honorary professorship at George Washington University. There are numerous books on her work, including Breaking the Rules: Audrey Flack, a Retrospective, 1950-1990 by Thalia Gouma Peterson, published by the Abrams Publishing Company in New York. Audrey Flack is the author of three books, On Painting (Abrams 1986), The Daily Muse (Abrams 1989), and Art & Soul (Penguin USA 1991). She is currently in the process of writing a sequel to Art & Soul, as well as a memoir.






























